Tatiana has academic training and work experience in both economic and workforce issues as well as in health care. Her work experiences have focused upon a mix of economics and health care, including several state and federal contracts, but more prominently, foundation-level grants related to the provision of health care services to racial/ethnic minorities. The research conducted in these grants has included critical evaluation of demographic trends, availability and accessibility of health care and other social services, barriers to optimal care and knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors of providers and patients. Dr. Bailey is currently principal investigator for a worksite wellness program, funded by the Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan Foundation. Her economic and statistical training also enables her to gauge the financial and social context of target populations. As a bilingual Latina, she also works on a grant funded by the Lumina Foundation examining postsecondary educational opportunities for Hispanics. She has extensively used surveys, longitudinal and cross-sectional designs, randomized control trials (RCT), demographic (non-RCT) descriptive methods and both quantitative and qualitative techniques for analyses. Tatiana is a reviewer for grants for the Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Michigan Foundation. She is also a board member for National Heritage Academy Schools and Integrated Health Associates.

Tatiana has a MA in Economics and a Ph.D. in Public Health, both from the University of Michigan.
